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THE SWORD MENTALITY

One of my favorite movie series is the "Lord of the Rings" series. "It's got all kinds of intrigue, and interwoven stories....plot and subplot and subplot of subplot...loads of overtones and subtle lessons, as well as great, quotable oneliners...all based on a really great book series by J.R.R. Tolkien. While the books are great, the movies I like a little better...why? Because I'm a guy and I love the WEAPONRY. Swords are awesome and they are all over this movie. Swords are MAN weapons... yeah, you may like guns and I agree, it's bad to bring a sword to a gunfight, but I like swords



better. Every boy wants a sword...every stick a boy ever plays with, if he has it long enough, BECOMES a sword. Sometimes, it becomes a sword that your Mama takes away from you because you hit the preacher's kid with it, but he was asking for it, I swear.

Swords are great MAN weapons because they are easy to operate...just swing them fast and swing them hard at whatever you want to get rid of. If it doesn't work right, just swing it harder and swing it faster...that's easy.

As Christians, though, bringing a "sword" mentality to your Christian life can be dangerous to you. Many well-meaning Christ followers live by the sword mentality...if I mess up, then that means I just need to "swing harder and faster" and I can be righteous. If they can't swing hard enough, then, they struggle with all types of things..."God hates me", "I hate God", "I'm not good enough"...frustration, anger, inadequacy...you name it. They may justify a sincontrolled behavior or just accept a life that is worse than God intended.

What we miss is that we were never intended to be able to swing hard enough to be right with God. That honor is Christ's, on our behalf. We are to defeat sin in our lives by walking in the Spirit of God, allowing Him to change and mold us into what He'd have us be. My job is more about becoming like Christ than it is about "not" being a liar or a thief or a gossip or a murderer. The Christian life is not simple "habit management". God is not satisfied with us just "not being" what we were and "not doing" what we used to do...He has a much greater plan than that for our lives...something valuable and worthwhile. We don't live

in some reality where just avoiding the don'ts of Scripture keep us sin-free, no sin is ANYTHING, morally good or morally bad, that is different than what God would have for us at the moment. When we think that we've got this buffet of good and bad things in life and we are just to pick the good we want, then we miss the point of sin. God's not into stuffing our "moral resume'", He's into us living the life He created for us to live. It's a life where sin is killed by submitting to Him and His will, not by our force of will, but by exposure and association with the Spirit of God. As I am influenced by God and as I submit to His direction, the behaviors fall away as the control of sin is replaced by the control of the Spirit in my heart. Still, God lets us choose. We can swing away or rest in Him, but remember this saying that I re-worded slightly, because it carries some wisdom here. You can live by the sword or you can die by the sword.

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The History of **Memorial Day**

Though many people are quick to refer to Memorial Day as the unofficial beginning of

summer, the day is much more than that. Initially known as Decoration Day, Memorial Day is a day to remember those military members who died in service of the country.

The origins of Memorial Day remain a topic of debate. In 1966, President Lyndon Johnson declared Waterloo, N.Y. as the official birthplace of Memorial Day. However, the roots of Memorial Day likely run much deeper, as researchers at Duke University note that during the Civil War, organized women's groups in the south had begun to decorate the graves of fallen soldiers.

Memorial Day as we know it today can likely be traced to Charleston, S.C., where teachers, missionaries and some members of the press gathered on May 1, 1865 to honor fallen soldiers. During the Civil War, captured





Union soldiers were held at the Charleston Race Course and hundreds died during captivity. Upon their deaths, soldiers were buried in unmarked graves. When the Civil War ended, the May Day gathering was organized as a memorial to all the men who had died during captivity. The burial ground was landscaped, and those freed as a result of the Civil War played an integral role in the event at the Charleston Race Course.

While the event in Charleston might have been the first Memorial Day-type celebration in the southern United States, General John A. Logan is often cited as inspiring similar events in the north. As commander-in-chief of the Grand Army of the Republic, a veterans' organization for men who served in the Civil War, General Logan issued a proclamation just five days after the Charleston event that called for Decoration Day to be observed annually across the country. Logan preferred the event not be held on the anniversary of any particular battle, and thus the day was observed for the first time on May 30. Celebrating the day in May also was significant to event organizers because May is a month when flowers are in bloom, making it easier for observers of the holiday to place flowers on the graves of fallen soldiers.

In 1868, events were held at more than 180 cemeteries in 27 states, and those figures nearly doubled in 1869. By 1890, every northern state officially recognized Decoration Day as a state holiday. But southern states honored their dead on a different day until after World War I, when the holiday was changed to recognize Americans who died in any war and not just the Civil War. Nearly every state now celebrates Memorial Day, a name for the holiday first used in 1882, on the last Monday in May.



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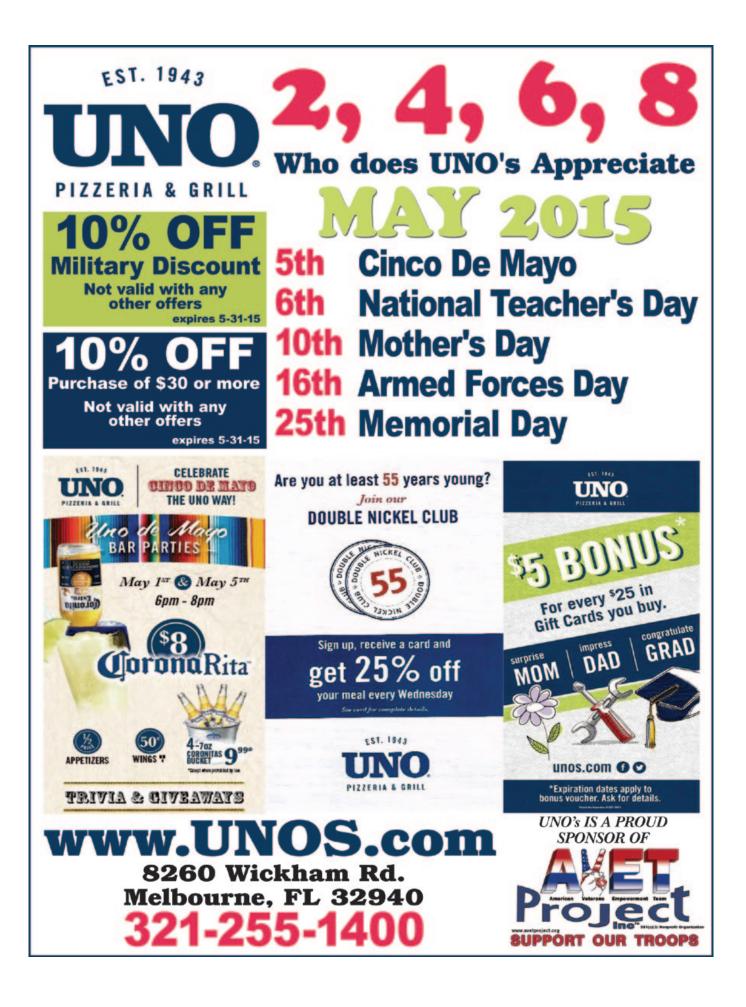

Memorial Day started in1866, shortly after the Civil War ended. About 25 Cities on the Eastern Coast claim to have been the birthplace of Memorial Day, and in the spring several tributes were held in various places.

A Mississippi group of women visited Graves to honor the dead, of both Confederate and Union Soldiers.

1868 General John A Logan established Decoration Day to be held May 30th as time for the nation to decorate the graves of the Civil War with flowers. (It's believed that date was chosen because flowers are in bloom all over the Country). By 1890 each State made Decoration Day an official Holiday. In 1971 Congress changed this to "Memorial Day" and declared it a National Holiday.

1915 the tradition of wearing red poppies began when the famous poem "In Flanders Fields" inspired overseas war secretary to do so.

Household chores can be a pain in the

sacroiliac. Unless you're careful, routine activities around the home - washing dishes, vacuuming, even talking on

the phone - can strain your back, including the sacroiliac area near the tailbone, and result in debilitating discomfort.

But you can protect

your back by knowing the right way to go about such activities, according to the American Chiropractic Association (ACA).

Consider lifting. It doesn't matter



whether you're picking up your child or a heavy bucket of water, you need to do it the proper way to avoid injury.

How? Bend from the knees, not the

waist. As you lift, hold the item as close to your body as possible. If you have to turn to place it, step in the direction of the turn. That

way, you're not twisting your body and straining your spine.

Back-Saving Tips

The American Chiropractic Association

suggest the following do's and don'ts for chores and relaxation:

When you wash dishes, open the cabinet beneath the sink, bend one knee and put your foot on the shelf under the sink. Lean against the counter so some of your weight is supported in front.

When ironing, raise one foot a bit. Place it on a small stool or a book to take some strain off your back.

To vacuum, use a "fencer's stance." Put all your weight on one foot, then step forward and back with the other foot as you push the vacuum forward and back. Use the back foot as a pivot when you turn.

While talking on the phone, don't cradle the phone between your ear and shoulder. That can lock up the spinal joints in the neck and upper back, and cause pain. Instead, hold

the phone with your hand or use the speakerphone.

While watching television or relaxing, don't use the sofa arm as a pillow. The angle is much too sharp for your neck.

Use a cold pack if your back begins to hurt. Wrap an ice pack in a towel moistened with warm water. The warmth gives way to gradual cold, which likely will alleviate the discomfort. (No ice? Try frozen veggies instead.)

If pain persists for more than a day or two or if you experience numbness, tingling or weakness in your arms or legs, see a doctor of chiropractic.

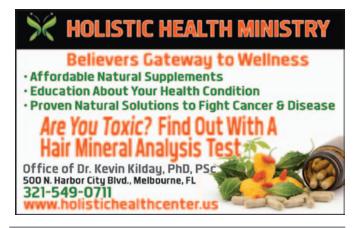

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CABLE VS DSL FOR CORD CUTTERS SPOTLIGHT ON COMPUTING

If you are currently fed up with your internet and cable provider and are

thinking of going with DSL for internet and just using an antenna and Netflix/ Hulu/Amazon/Roku for the rest, you are considering becoming is a 'cord-cutter,' which refers to households that have cut out cable or satellite television service and gone to Internet streaming services for their content. Let's first address the cable vs DSL question, which in many ways is like the classic Ford vs Chevy argument -there is no one answer for everyone.

The reality of internet connections is that where you live, who else is on the same network, and what you want to use the connection for, will play big roles in your overall experience. In general, cable can provide more raw speed for the buck, including the all-important upload speeds for gamers and heavy up-loaders of pictures and video.

The downside to cable internet service is that you're sharing the connection with others in your neighborhood, so performance can vary based on the quantity and activities of your neighbors. Think of it like water pressure; if everyone decides to water their lawn at 5:30pm, you'll all notice a drop in water pressure everywhere.

DSL connections may be at a slightly slower-rated speed, but your experience isn't impacted by others. DSL speeds are impacted by how far you are from the provider's hub: The farther you are, the slower the average speeds. Remember that all of the bandwidth providers advertise speeds 'UP TO' meaning 'your mileage may vary' (and likely will) so don't base your decision to switch on the advertising you see.

Before you assume that your current internet provider's service is the problem, make sure you've thoroughly eliminated your own infrastructure as the cause. Older cable modems, routers, and even an old Ethernet cable can often be the cause of performance issues, so you may want to do some troubleshooting of your own equipment first.





You can also use sites like http://testmy.net to run speed tests on the connection between your connection and the Internet at large. If the test results show that you actually have a pretty solid connection (5Mbps or higher), then the problem may be your computer, cabling, or networking gear.

HD quality video streams generally do best with 5Mbps download speeds or greater per stream, so if you expect to use multiple streams on a regular basis, more is better.

If your speeds are really slow, ask neighbors that pay for the same service to do the same test. If their speeds are a lot faster than yours, the problem could be a damaged cable connection in or outside of your house, in which case you should schedule a technician from your provider to test everything.

To determine whether you can live without cable television service, you have to start with what you want to be able to watch. Most people are surprised when they see all the Digital HD channels that you can get for free with an HD antenna that ranges from \$30 to \$75 (54 channels in my area).

From there, you'll have to do a thorough review of the content offered by all of the streaming boxes (Roku, Apple TV, Chromecast, Xbox, etc.) and streaming services (Netflix, iTunes, Hulu Plus, Amazon Prime, etc.) to figure out what you're willing to pay for.

Newer streaming services such as Sling TV https://www.sling.com which includes ESPN and the much anticipated HBO online will make cord cutting even more appealing.

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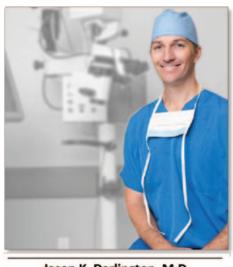

The iStent[®], the smallest implantable device that the FDA has ever approved, is a microsurgical implant placed at the time of cataract surgery that is designed to lower and control eye pressure in patients who have glaucoma as well as cataracts.

The device represents the latest innovation in treating patients with glaucoma at the time of their cataract surgery, according to Jason K. Darlington, MD, cataract surgeon and fellowship-trained cornea and glaucoma specialist The Eye Institute for Medicine & Surgery.

"The iStent is highly effective, as it reduces eye pressure twenty-four hours per day. By continually maintaining a healthy eye pressure, the risk of suffering a loss of vision due to glaucoma is greatly reduced," reports Dr. Darlington, who has performed thousands of ophthalmic surgical procedures.

DEVICE BENEFITS

There are many benefits to reducing or eliminating the need for glaucoma eye drops, explains Dr. Darlington, who completed the prestigious Lindstrom Fellowship in cornea, refractive and glaucoma surgery under Dr. Samuelson, at the Phillips Eye Institute in Minneapolis. Dr. Samuelson was a thought leader and an integral participant in the FDA approval process of the iStent.

Over a period of years, glaucoma medications can cost many thousands of dollars. Additionally, there is often a burden placed on patients to use eye medications multiple times per day in an attempt to control their glaucoma. When compliance with medication regimens is less than ideal, a loss of vision may result.

Reducing or eliminating the need for glaucoma medications may also eliminate many side effects, such as redness, dryness, irritation and excessive eyelash growth.

"Patients and their families have a great sense of comfort knowing that the iStent is working to maintain a healthy eye pressure twenty-four hours per day, oftentimes without the need for additional eye medications," explains Dr. Darlington. "Controlling eye pressure throughout the day and night on a continual basis leads to better long-term results."

The specific benefits of the iStent include placement at the time of cataract surgery, with no need for a second eye surgery; no additional recovery time or medications outside of the standards for cataract surgery, virtually no risk as compared to more complex valve or tube surgeries for glaucoma and substantial financial savings relating to glaucoma medications.

"In my experience, the need for fewer medications makes for happier patients," states Dr. Darlington, who has performed research utilizing a double-mirrored lens to facilitate the placement of the iStent at the time of cataract surgery. "The goal of my research is to help ophthalmic surgeons all over the world bring the iStent technology to their patients.

"My hope is that by doing so, we may help many thousands more patients enjoy a lifetime of good

vision and spare them from suffering the debilitating effects of vision loss associated with glaucoma," Dr. Darlington states.

EARLY DETECTION IS KEY

The key to achieving a successful outcome with respect to glaucoma management is early detection of the disease and appropriate therapy, according to Dr. Darlington.

"Glaucoma is known as the *sneak thief of sight* because, in most cases, it is a symptomless disease process until a great deal of vision has been lost," he explains. "This is why a thorough, dilated, annual, eye examination by your optometric physician or ophthalmologist is critical. Your eye doctor can assess the various structures inside of your eyes and determine if you are at risk."

Some of the key measures doctors consider when determining if a patient is at risk for glaucoma include: family history; eye pressures, taken by *applanation* (observation of the cornea); appearance of the patient's optic nerves, the patient's corneal thickness, computerized three-dimensional analysis of the patient's retinal nerve fiber layer, computerized analysis of the patient's visual field and the communication between the brain and the optic nerves, and analysis of the depth of the anterior chamber of the eye.

Some people are at greater risk than others for developing glaucoma, advises Dr. Darlington. Those at greater risk include people over age 40, women, people who are nearsighted, those who suffer from diabetes; people of African, Asiatic, Hispanic or Northern European ancestry; people with a close blood relative who has the condition and people who regularly use steroids, such as those on chronic pain medications or inhalers for asthma.

OPTIMIZING OUTCOMES

One of the most frequent conditions that patients seek Dr. Darlington's expertise for is cataracts. "In many cases, my colleague Dr. James McManus and I can help turn back the hands of time and restore a patient's vision, making it similar to the way it was, not just before the person had cataracts, but like it was before they needed reading glasses due to age-related changes."

Restoring and optimizing vision to this level requires the use of special, high-technology lens implants at the time of cataract surgery. Not every patient is a good candidate for these lenses, but for those who are, the vision and independence that they achieve are often described as *life-changing*. For other patients, the greatest challenge to achieving excellent vision, once cataracts have developed, is astigmatism – an irregular curvature of the cornea.

"Depending upon the amount of astigmatism that a patient has, Dr. McManus and I can recommend correction either via a specialized astigmatism-correcting lens implant, known as a *Toric Intraocular Lens*, or we may suggest limbal relaxing incisions be placed," Dr. Darlington says.

These incisions, made directly on the patient's cornea – the outer window of the eye – bring images into focus for many patients who have a low-to-moderate degree of astigmatism. With astigmatism corrected or largely eliminated, some of these patients are able to see clearly for the first time in their lives without the use of eyeglasses or contact lenses.

Dr. Darlington, who has extensive experience performing cataract and glaucoma surgery as well as corneal transplants and refractive eye surgery, is available to see new patients at his offices in Rockledge, Melbourne and Palm Bay. Consultations may be arranged by calling (321) 722-4443.

Drowning is the second leading cause of unintentional death among U.S. children ages 1-9. Most infant drownings occur in bathtubs and buckets. Among children ages 1-4, most drownings occur in home swimming pools.

According to the CDC, the highest rate if drowning is in the 0-4 year age group; adolescent boys are the second largest group of drowning victims. It is important to know that children can drown in even one inch of water. Following are swimming safety tips from the AAP:

1) Supervision is essential for all children, regardless of whether they have had formal swimming lessons. Many children who have drowned were being supervised



by adults who turned their backs for just a moment.

2) Families with pools or spas should put up four-sided barrier fences (at least 4-foot high) that cannot be climbed and include a self-latching gate to separate the pool/ spa from the house and the rest of the yard.

3) Portable and inflatable pools also pose drowning risks, and these pools also should be fenced in. Children can easily climb over or fall into the pools, even when ladders are removed.

4) Pool and spa drains should have special covers and vacuum systems that prevent body entrapment and hair entanglement.

To ensure a fun yet safe time for everyone, parents should use multiple layers of protection such as supervising children, learning CPR, and installing fences and an alarm and cover for the home pools/spas.

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SIGNS IN THE HEAVENS?

CCM: Together, doing life RIGHT!

You may have heard something in the news about a "blood moon tetrad", and that these have a possible connection to end times prophecy. But what is a blood moon, and does it have any significance?



Throughout history, there have been sequences of four total lunar eclipses in a row. (A sequence of four is a tetrad.) These are known as "blood moon tetrads" and are not particularly unusual. What makes this particular blood moon tetrad rare and unusual is the fact that the eclipses occur on Hebrew feast days, over Jerusalem. This latest blood moon tetrad began with a full lunar eclipse on Passover 2014, a second one on the feast of Tabernacles 2014, the third on Passover 2015 (just this past April 4th), and the fourth one will occur on the feast of Tabernacles 2015 (on September 28th).

In addition, on November 3, 2013, there was an H3 solar eclipse over Jerusalem. An H3 eclipse is a Class 3 Hybrid, meaning that it is both total and annular. It is fairly rare, occurring only about 4% of the time. I found all this information on NASA's eclipse website, which is the same place I found data about the lunar tetrads.

Recall Genesis 1:14 (NKJV), where we're told, "Then God said, 'Let there be lights in the firmament of the heavens to divide the day from the night; and let them be for signs and seasons, and for days and years.'" (Emphasis mine). So here we see some signs in the heavens.

By themselves, heavenly signs may not be that compelling to us. However, when combined with earthly signs, our eyes are opened. Daniel 12:4 speaks of an increase in knowledge, and there has been an explosion of knowledge in the last 150 years, like nothing seen before in history. As well, Matthew 24:37 and Luke 17:28-30 (compared to Genesis 6:13 and Jude 1:7) speak of an increase in violence and sexual immorality, which we clearly see in these modern times, and such things are escalating.

Luke 21:25-26 speaks of an increase in the frequency and intensity of natural disasters. These events are spoken of in the news, but economist Dr. Robert Hartwig, president of the Insurance Information Institute (a man, therefore, who is in a position to know), has said, "The number of U.S. disaster declarations has been trending sharply upward, particularly over the past 15 years."



What does this mean for us? We have seen signs in the heavens and signs on the earth. There are many, many others that I do not have space to document. In Matthew 24:33, Jesus said that "when you see all these things" you know the time of His coming is "near, right at the door."

Is that Signal or Noise?

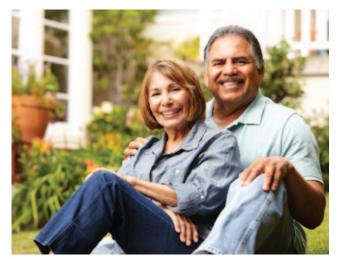

When dealing with a hearing loss, or decreased hearing thresholds, the first order of business that we all attend to as professionals, is that of making all of the important sounds needed for understanding speech loud enough to be perceived again. The second order, is to make sure that those sounds being amplified are never amplified too much, or to the point of being uncomfortable. 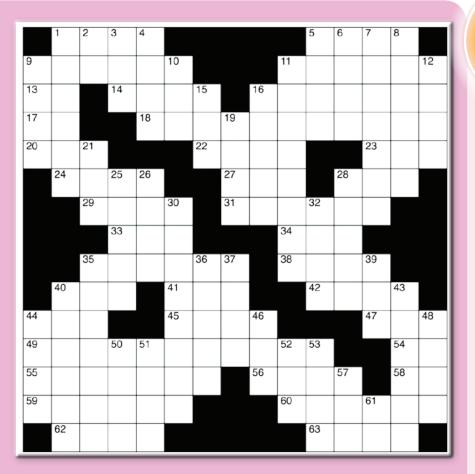

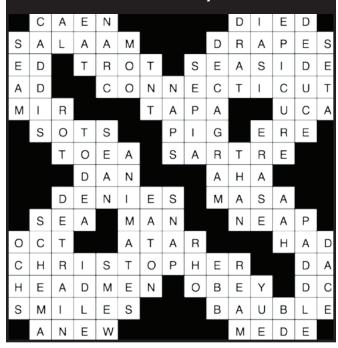

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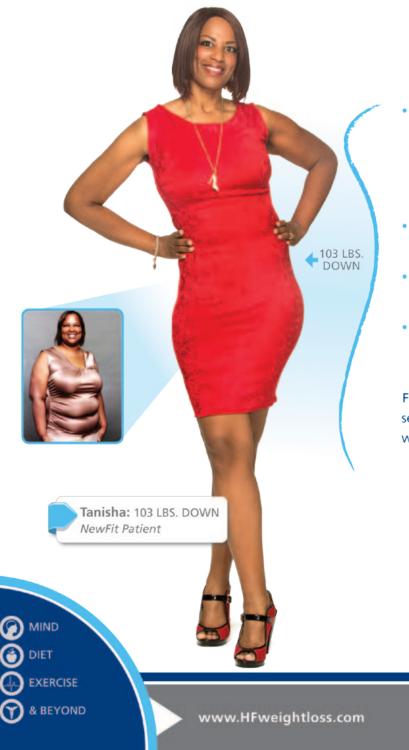






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
