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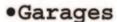
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STOP DREAMING ABOUT QUALITY SLEEP AND DO SOMETHING

An old Chinese proverb states, "Only when one cannot sleep does one know how long the night is." Anyone who's ever experienced an occasional bout with insomnia—and that's most of us—can relate to this all too well.

In fact, surveys have shown that between 40 and 60 percent of the general population has trouble sleeping. Daily stress and worries, pressures from job and family, body aches and pains caused by uncomfortable beds or pillows, and a host of other issues can keep a person from getting enough quality sleep.

Sleep is critical to good health and functioning, so lack of it is a serious matter. "Sleep is one of the most important functions of the brain," says Frederick R. Carrick, DC, PhD, president of the American Chiropractic Association's Council on Neurology. Through it, our bodies recharge and renew for the next day's challenges.

As wellness experts, doctors of chiropractic can provide patients with a different approach to their sleeping problems— without the use of sleeping pills, which leave many people in a mental

haze the next morning. To start, here are a few helpful tips they would recommend for the sleepless in Seattle (or any city, for that matter):

Exercise regularly. Exercising in the morning is best, but if you must exercise in the evening, do so at least two or three hours before bedtime. Any later, and your increased heart rate can interfere with your sleep.

Limit your intake of caffeinated beverages such as coffee, colas and tea—try to avoid them altogether late in the day and near bedtime.

If you have trouble sleeping and then get thirsty, drink tap water at room temperature (cold water may disturb the digestive system).

Eat an early dinner. Eating after 6 p.m. may interfere with sleep as your body works to digest the food you've eaten.

Go to bed at the same time each night and get up at the same time each morning. The routine will help your body know when it is time to rest.

Keep your bedroom at a cool, comfortable temperature and try to make it as dark as possible when you're ready for bed.

Useful mattress facts...

A mattress should provide uniform support from head to toe. If there are gaps between your body and your mattress (such as at the waist), you're not getting the full support that you need.

Every few months, turn your mattress clockwise, or upside down, so that body indentations are kept to a minimum. It's also good to rotate the mattress frame every so often to reduce wear and tear.

If you're not in the market for a new mattress, and your current mattress is too firm, you can soften it up by putting a 1- to 2-inch-thick padding on top of it - usually available at mattress and bedding stores.

Next, pillow talk...

When choosing a pillow, be selective. When lying on your side, your head and neck should remain level with your mid and lower spine. When lying on your back, your head and neck should remain level with your upper back and spine. In other words, your pillow should not be so thick that it causes your head and neck to be propped up or angled sharply away from your body. If you find yourself sleeping on your side with one hand propped under your pillow, that's a clue that you're not getting the support you need from that pillow.

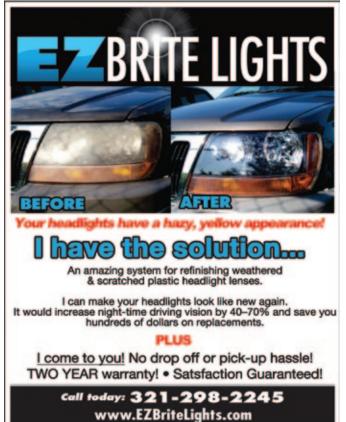

and recovery information in hand. You will get resistance that is common. Do not give up. If you need help Google or look in directories online.

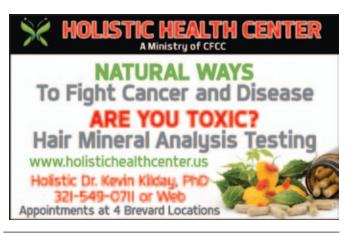

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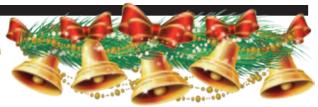

Moussaka was the main meal at my in-laws when my husband was alive. I got to love it and to this day I will still make it. You can make it and freeze it and defrost in the refrigeration when you want to have it. It is so good. Enjoy.

Moussaka

6 eggplants vegetable oil (for frying the eggplants)

For the meat sauce: 2 lbs chopped beef or

lamb

2 red onions (chopped)

2 cloves of garlic (chopped)

1-14 oz can chopped

tomatoes

2 tbsp tomato puree 1 tsp sugar

1-8oz glass of red wine

pinch sea salt and freshly ground black pepper

1 bay leaf pinch of cinnamon or one cinnamon stick

1/4 c olive oil For the béchamel sauce: 3 1/2 c milk 1/2 stick butter

3.5 oz flour pinch of nutmeg

2 egg yolks

3.5 oz Parmigiano-Reggiano or Kefalotyri

Begin by preparing the eggplants. Remove the stalks from the eggplants and cut them into slices, 1 cm thick. Season with salt and place in a colander for about 30min.

Rinse the eggplants with plenty of water and squeeze with your hands, to get rid of the excessive water. Pat them dry and fry in plenty of oil, until nicely colored. Place them on some paper, in order to absorb the oil.

Prepare the meat sauce for the moussaka. Heat a large pan to medium -high heat and add the olive oil. Stir in the chopped onions and sauté, until softened and slightly colored. Stir in the garlic, tomato puree and the mince breaking it up with

a wooden spoon and sauté. Pour in the red wine and wait to evaporate. Add the tomatoes, the sugar, a pinch of cinnamon, 1 bay leaf and some salt and pepper. Bring to the boil, turn the heat down and simmer with the lid on for about a half an hour, until most of the juices have evaporated.

Prepare the béchamel sauce. Use a large pan to melt some butter over low-medium heat. Add the flour whisking continuously to make a paste. Add warmed milk in a steady stream; keep whisking in order to prevent your sauce from getting lumpy. If the sauce still needs to thicken, boil over low heat while continuing to stir. Remove the pan from the stove and stir in the rest of the

ingredients. Whisk quickly, in order to prevent the eggs from turning an omelette!

Assemble the moussaka. For this moussaka recipe you will need a large baking dish, Butter the bottom and sides of the pan and layer the eggplants. Pour in the meat sauce and even out. Add a second layer of eggplants, top with the béchamel sauce and smooth out with a spatula.

Sprinkle with grated cheese and bake the moussaka in preheated oven at 325-350 for about an hour, until crust turns light golden





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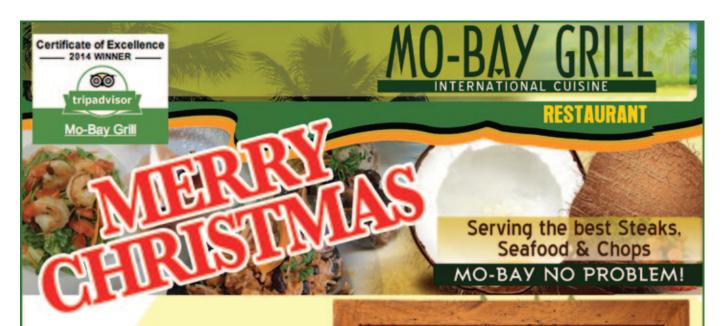
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LESSONS FROM THE LEON PODESTA EMAIL HACK

SPOTLIGHT ON COMPUTING

There are many lessons that can be learned from the recent high-profile email hacks to several public figures. The most important lesson is that people, not security measures are the easiest to compromise.

The Weakest Link

As anyone in IT security will tell you, no matter how sophisticated the cyber-security system may be, the humans using the system are always the weakest link. In most cases, hackers employ what's called 'social engineering' to trick users into divulging critical information that allows them to be exploited.

In the Podesta case, a 'spear-phishing' email claiming the password had been stolen convinced both the users and the IT person that it was a legitimate warning from Google. Spear-phishing refers to a more targeted exploit because the hackers know that you use a specific online service.

In this case, since the recipient's email address ended with @gmail.com, they created a 'stolen password' alert that appeared to be from Google.

Tell Tale Signs

As with most phishing messages, a close examination of the punctuation and grammar would have tipped off an observant reader.

The lack of commas in appropriate places, the relative vagueness of the message and the fact that they ended the message with 'Best, The Mail Team' are clear red flags.

The reason social engineering tricks work so well is that the anxiety created by the message causes most people to focus on the salacious subject line and scary claims instead of the message in its entirety.

Another way to sniff out suspicious messages is to use the hover method as described in this video: https://youtu.be/-aay-00BCKE

Thoroughly Read Messages

The IT person also fell for the fake message but in their defense, they replied with a specific link to use to change the password, which the frantic user didn't use. Instead, the user (Podests) went back to the original



message and clicked on the button that said 'Change Password' which sent him right where the hackers wanted him. Had he followed the instructions from the IT person, even though the message was a fake, he would not have been compromised.

Stolen Password Protection

Another important step that the IT person suggested in his response was to make sure that 2-step verification was turned on https://goo.gl/SCa64p which would have kept the hackers out even with the password.

2-step verification creates a second layer of protection in the event someone steals your password. With it turned on, whenever the site detects a valid login from an unknown location or device, it sends a special code via text message to your smartphone. Without the code, the person that has your password won't be able to get in AND you will have been alerted that your password has been compromised.

Never Click Links

We've all heard the 'never click links in email messages' a million times, but cleverly crafted messages can scare people into taking immediate action.

Even when you think a warning is legitimate, avoid the links and manually type in the address of the service in question to see if the same warning comes up when you log in.

The best protection you have is your common sense. Always ask yourself "is this legitimate?" "is this logical?" "can I contact the company (or email provider) in another way?" Always be suspicious. Most viruses and hacks are caused by messages designed to outsmart the user.

Dr. McManus wants to encourage Brevard County residents who may be experiencing vision loss due to cataracts, who are uninsured and in need, to visit his website, **TheChristmasCataract.com**. There are instructions on the website explaining how an individual or their loved one can share a photo and their story describing how vision loss has impacted their life and how they believe their life could improve if their vision was restored.

"Poor vision associated with cataracts can have a profound effect on all aspects of a person's life," according to Dr. McManus. "It can prevent a person from working, from taking care of loved ones who depend on them, or even performing daily activities that most of us take for granted."

Cataracts are a clouding of the natural, clear lens inside the eye. Cataracts are usually age related but may occur due to heredity, the presence of certain systemic illnesses, the use of certain medications, trauma, or other factors.

For a period of time changes in one's eyeglass prescription may improve vision to an acceptable level. However, once a cataract progresses past a certain point, vision and a person's ability to do the things they need to do on a daily basis begin to become compromised. At this point surgery is usually the only viable option to improve vision.

Dr. McManus is pleased to continue this sight restoring program that he created and that he hopes to continue for many years to come. "Brevard County has been a wonderful place to live, to raise a family and to practice medicine. I want to give back to the community that has been so good to my family and me," states Dr. McManus.

Unfortunately, not everyone who submits their story will be eligible for the surgery due to such factors as the presence of other eye conditions or a health status that would indicate a contraindication to outpatient surgery. Dr. McManus and Dr. Darlington will review all the entries and carefully determine the individuals most likely to benefit from cataract surgery. 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South Brevard's **History**

Many have found this part of Florida to be a great destination. Whether visiting on vacation, here for the winter season or all year around, we all can identify a favorite time of year and a favorite reason to call Brevard home.



William Twining Wells, best known for the development of an

improved process for preserving iron, came to Melbourne with his family in 1896. After visiting many places in Florida such as Lake Worth, Winter Park & Jensen Beach, the Wells family explained their decision to move to Melbourne in an article published on April 4, 1896 in the Melbourne Times: "...The very first day of our stay here we found congenial people and as the week went by we stayed on enjoying the good fishing, sailing and other outdoor amusements and last but not least gaining health and strength daily from the fine pure dry air." The dry air was important as Mrs. Wells had been diagnosed with pneumonia, prompting their departure from New Jersey. Their house on a bluff off of US1 in Melbourne is still standing today and is known as Green Gables.

Today, as in the past, our area can be defined similarly. Our community is diverse. With an industrial base that covers everything from amusement through transportation, the people of this county work hard and then head into the weekend to relax. Although much has changed in and ground Brevard over the years, we still find that the fundamentals of the community have stayed the same. 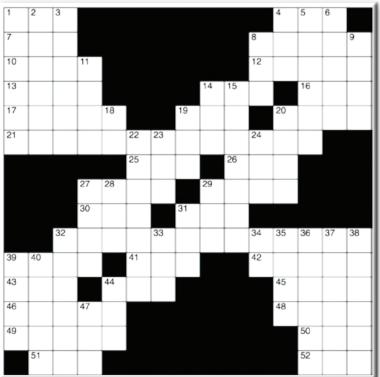
